

What is a Folk Camp?

About eighty people of all age groups - families, singles, couples, friends from all over Europe - camping on the grounds of the Schloss. Those who prefer to live more comfortably can rent a room in the building or a holiday flat in the village. The idea is imported from The Folk Camps Society in England, although naturally with some changes to suit the international atmosphere.



What sort of Music and Dances?

In Folk Camps everybody is welcome and encouraged to play a musical instrument and join in dancing. The music and dance repertoire is based on traditional folk dance, mainly English: longway sets, squares or circles. Some Dutch, French and German dances have also found their way into our collection. Of course the repertoire of the camp leader and the musician is also important. But

everyone at the camp is welcome to introduce new music and dances.



What do you do all day...

..besides eating good, full meals, drinking tea and helping a bit to run the camp? In the morning you can take part in music and dance workshops. For musicians

children there is a special music workshop led by the children's musician. In the afternoon you can visit the local sights, go to a wine festival, go for a swim, or stay in camp to practise a dance or some music, or even just be lazy! Every night at eight o'clock there is a ceilidh in the huge cellar, with dances, songs and games for everyone to join in. Among other things our programme includes a barbecue, a night walk and a picnic.

What you must bring with you

Besides your personal belongings you must provide your own tent and **camping equipment, plates, cutlery** and a **teacloth**. Raincoats, boots and a torch are recommended, also solid shoes for dancing, as the floors are a bit uneven.. If you can play (or want to learn) a musical instrument bring that too!

When you should arrive

The campsite will be open from Friday afternoon, but no other Folk Camp facilities will be available until Saturday morning. On Friday evening you must provide your own meals. The Folk Camp officially starts with breakfast on Saturday and continues until breakfast the next Saturday.

We usually try to organize a get together for Friday evening with food and drinks at your own costs.

How to get there

by train: to Würzburg, then by bus to Volkach. The postbus service from Volkach to Schweinfurt passes through Zeilitzheim. If you give us notice we could also collect you in Volkach.

by car: Motorway (A7) towards Würzburg. Change on to A70 towards Schweinfurt - take exit No.7 (B286) towards Gerolzhofen; Follow the signs to Kolitzheim/ Zeilitzheim.

In Zeilitzheim you park your car in the village square and book in with the folk camp staff, who will be somewhere on the premises of the Schloß.

There is a discount for those who have been folkcamping in Germany during the last seven years. A further discount of 5% is granted on invoices paid in full by 20th June 2012.

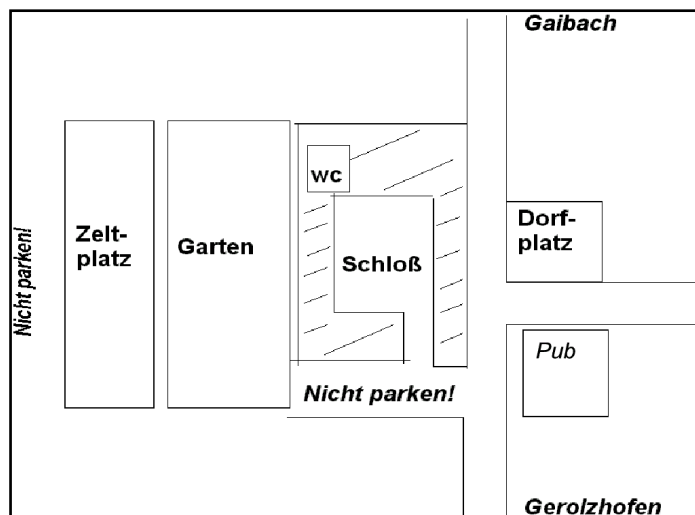

What you must do!

You will also have duties in the camp ... ! Since the (unpaid) staff, including the *leader, musician, caterer* and *warden* cannot, and do not want to, do everything themselves, everybody helps. Either you choose a small daily duty (for example clearing away the rubbish), or you help with the cooking and serving meals one day under the supervision of the caterer. It is necessary that everybody takes on a small job in order to ensure the smooth running of the camp. It is particularly important to help with the final clear up on the last day. The distribution of all these duties is organised by the warden.

Please make sure there is enough space left around the yard exits at the Schloß and in the village for the farmers' combine harvesters!

What does it cost?

Prices shown here are for a complete week. For those who only want to come to camp for a few days, prices are calculated per day. Please notice that if you arrive without registering in advance we cannot guarantee a space on the camp site.

The prices shown here include a camping place on the Schloss grounds, use of the Folk Camp facilities and all camp activities.

Please Notice: Special diets cannot be provided. Dogs are not allowed.

If you prefer to stay in a room, this can be arranged directly with Schloss Zeilitzheim (telephone +49 9381 9389 -- English spoken!). Please let us know if you have rented a room, as it is important for our planning, and mention Folk Camp when you book the room.
